these sites have been continuously online for 25+ years by now.

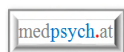
The clue then was: *open science*, *open resources*, ***open access***, aiming fair use: feedback, citation, quotation, and – discussion.

As I got only one single comment from Canada within the recent decade, while download rates were exceeding 12 GBs p. a., I felt, the experiment had not met the corresponding partners.

Subsequently large parts of the content were offered for free, others subject to remuneration. Not one item has voluntarily been paid for, eversince – which is rather unfair.

As a consequence, new rules have been established: As we do not gain profits from data mining / -trading, we decided to leave the majority of articles cost-free, others are published under the conditions of fair trade. If not paid for, the IP will be blocked, illegal downloads will be charged € 30,- per 1 MB. Many users therefore changed to TOR browsers and continued their usage without respect, nor justification whatsoever.
